#### LAKE DATA & **PROGRAMS**

VLAWMO's primary source of income is Storm Sewer Utility (SSU) fees. The average single family homeowner in VLAWMO pays \$62.04/year (\$5.17/month) to support projects and programs that improve the watershed.

Additional funding for projects comes from grants from the Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency 319 Grant, and the Legislative-Citizen Commission on Minnesota Resources.



#### GRANT PROGRAMS

VLAWMO completed 14 grants in 2022. Highlights included 5 native plant restorations, 1 bee lawn, 1 downspout raingarden, and a large curb-cut raingarden as part of the new City of North Oaks entrance.

The 2022 impact of all the projects combined is estimated to reduce sedimentation into waterbodies by 167 lbs/yr, reduce total phosphorus by 1 lb/yr, and infiltrate into the ground about 4,518 gallons/yr.

As a local governing unit, VLAWMO administers the Wetland Conservation Act (WCA). WCA oversees new development as it pertains to wetland conservation. Any wetlands lost to development, by law, are to be replaced either on-site or elsewhere in the state through the purchase of wetland bank credits.

2022 was a very active year for VLAWMO, including construction of several partnership projects that help to enhance and protect the natural environment.

Over at Pleasant and Deep Lakes, a removal effort helped reduce carp population in the chain of lakes that drains into East Vadnais Lake, a valuable reservoir for the Saint Paul Regional Water Services. The VLAWMO grant program featured a large raingarden at the entrance to the City of North Oaks, and the Whitaker Pond Biochar Filter was a first in the watershed. These and several other voluntary restorations made a positive impact for water quality. The VLAWMO Board approved several policies and technical studies in 2022 including a public drainage policy and completion of early design guidance for a proposed wetland restoration upstream of Wilkinson Lake.


